Seat Carriage Identification Sheet

For Model A Fordor and Town Sedans (Excepting 28-29 Leatherbacks).



The diagrams above illustrated the several seat carriage units found in the 4 door sedans. Our experience indicated that the style found in any particular model does not necessarily follow the specs on the car. It is necessary to check with you to be sure we supply the correct carriage trim for your sedan.

Numbers 2 –3 are similar, but may be told apart by the features noted:

- #2 has wood side arms to provide tacking for welting trim.
- #3 has metal side arms with tacking for welting provided inside as indicated by dashed lines.
- #4 is the only one without the toe recess in back and has wide base rim, which holds the seat cushion in place by pins.
- #5 is the late 31' Slant Windshield version and is the only one with an all-metal base frame.

Please, let us know if your is # 2, 3, 4, or 5. If measurements differ from those shown, please indicate on the diagram. Thank you for your help.

1928-31 Model A for Fordor


The first model a fordor offered by ford was the 60 series body style and was made by the Briggs Coach Company in 1928-29, which can be recognized by the blind quarter panel. The front hinge pillar is made of wood and has a rail running from side to side under the dash

The 60-A and the 60-B Sedan top material covers the top down to the belt rail below the rear window. The A or B designates the color of the sedan top. The 60-C is often confuse with the Briggs Built 170.


The 170 Series, Briggs built body was also a steel back blind quarter panel coming out in 1929. It can be distinguished from the 60-C by its steel Front hinge pillar.

In 1929, besides the 170 series, ford introduced the 155 and 165 Fordor. Briggs and Murray Coach Companies made both. The Fordor had quarter panel windows on both sides, just behind the rear doors. The wood in the 155 and 165 Murray was the same but differs a great deal from the 155 and 165 Briggs. You can tell the difference between Briggs and Murray by the windows in the doors.

The Briggs:



The top of the Briggs door window is flat.



The top of the Murray door window is arched.

In 1931 Briggs and Murray made the Steel bodied 160 series; however, there is wood in the top and some tacking wood in the interior body panels. The "160" series can be recognized by its slanting windshield a characteristic of some 31-body styles.
